## OPENING CEREMONY

FRIDAY, MAY 23, 12:00 pm

The City of Charleston and Spoleto Festival USA kick off the festival with music, speeches, and special performances outside of Charleston City Hall.

## SUNSET SERENADE

FRIDAY, MAY 23, 8:00 pm

Join us at the U.S. Custom House for Piccolo Spoleto's annual curtain-raiser. This free, outdoor concert features the Charleston Symphony, conducted by Artistic Director and Concertmaster Yuriy Bekker. Guest soloists will join the CSO for a program filled with favorites from the stage and screen, alongside patriotic selections. Guest artist Kyaunnee Richardson will thrill the crowd with selections by George Gershwin, Leonard Bernstein, and Andrew Lloyd Webber.

## MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND

SATURDAY  
May 24

Marion Square provides the perfect backdrop to usher in the Festival, punctuated at midday by the lively arrival of the Seed and Feed Marching Abominable. Enjoy the Charleston Farmers Market, the Outdoor Art Exhibition, and a festive atmosphere for all. Cap off the day at the U.S. Custom House, where Seed and Feed returns for a whimsical Pajama March.

SUNDAY  
May 25

Mark your calendar for a full day of performances, including the Mt. Zion Spiritual Singers and Lowcountry Voices (ticketed). Listen to familiar patriotic tunes on the organ at Summerall Chapel at the Citadel. Bring the kids to the Charleston Museum for special festival programming, and don't miss the artisan booths at Marion Square.

MONDAY  
May 26

At noon, attend the patriotic concert by Charleston Men's Chorus at First (Scots) Presbyterian Church (ticketed), or a free 3pm Memorial Day Concert at Hampton Park featuring the Charleston Concert Band and Columbia Community Band. Head to Circular Church for a free performance by the New South Festival Singers, offering a capella sacred music.

St. Mary's Catholic Church, with its beautiful acoustics and architecture, serves as a stunning venue for matinee performances of musical masterpieces from earlier centuries.

Ease into the evening with public poetry readings in charming Washington Square Park, weekdays during the festival.

### Sand Sculpting Competition

Head to the Front Beach on the Isle of Palms to take part in or watch artists transform the shoreline into temporary masterpieces. Six prize categories will be awarded.

Dozens of South Carolina visual artists showcase recent works at City Gallery, including painting, sculpture, drawing, printmaking, and photography.
